Day 1 – Sunday 23 March

Arrive Adelaide Sofitel 2pm then depart for Magill Cellars on Adelaide's outskirts, the home of the famous shiraz, Penfolds Grange. Enjoy an ultimate experience tasting. Enjoy our welcome dinner at East End Cellars.

Day 2 – Monday 24 March

Depart for McLaren Vale, arriving at the iconic d'Arenberg Cube for a taste and views. Afterwards lunch at the winery that set Italian varieties for this region, Coriole. Your post lunch appointment is at the Enoteca of the acclaimed SC Pannell in McLaren Vale. Return to Adelaide, evening is free.

Day 3 – Tuesday 25 March

Depart for the famous family-held Henschke Winery in Eden Valley, visit Hill of Grace and taste its exquisite shiraz. Afterwards visit Seppeltsfield, lunch at Fino's, paired with the finest of the property, including 100-year-old tawny. Your afternoon visit is to Langmeil in Tanunda, home of the world's oldest shiraz (planted 1843). Return to Adelaide, evening is free.

Day 4 – Wednesday 26 March

Depart for Angaston to visit Australia's oldest family winery, Hill Smith Family Estates (est. 1849), including an exploration tasting and local produce lunch. Afterwards enjoy a royal visit to Chateau Tanunda for a Terroirs of the Barossa Tasting of 50 and 100 yo vines. Return to Adelaide; enjoy a hosted tasting of the depth of the Barossa, its history and diversity, served with supper.



Day 5 – Thursday 27 March

Depart for Marananga to visit Torbreck Vintners, modern makers of red grapes from old vineyards, afterwards lunch at Vintners in Angaston. Our afternoon visit is to Bird in Hand at Woodside, and afterwards transfer to accommodation at Mt Lofty House; enjoy an Adelaide Hills sparkling tasting and accompaniments.

Day 6 – Friday 28 March

Depart for Shaw & Smith, Balhannah (two Masters of Wine in residence) to enjoy select chardonnay and pinot noirs. Afterwards visit the Saturno Brothers at Longview Vineyard at Macclesfield for a tasting and light lunch. Our afternoon visit is to The Lane at Handorf. Final dinner is at Hardys Verandah Restaurant.

Day 7 – Saturday 29 March

Tour ends, departures for Adelaide or airport.
